



How do I apply for university? It could not be easier

You get expert advice from Brookhouse staff and individual counselling from visiting lecturers from NCUK partner universities. Brookhouse handles your application which is prioritised by the NCUK, and admission staff from partner universities help you make choices.

When do I start and finish?

For Kenyan 8.4.4 system students, you start immediately your KCSE exams finish in November and commence university the following September, having passed your final Foundation Year examinations in July.
