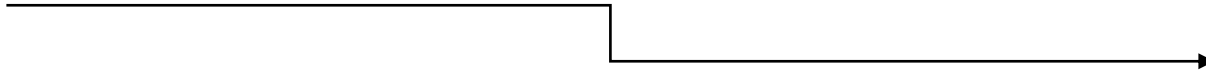

**Cost: KES 10000**

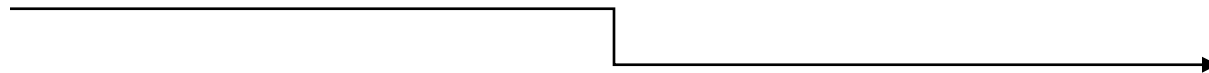
